What is Manga

Manga originated in Japan from centuries-old art traditions, evolving into modern comics influenced by both Japanese and Western styles.

- The word manga (漫画) combines man ("whimsical" or "entertaining") and ga ("pictures").
- Its roots trace back to 12th–13th century picture scrolls like *Chōjū-giga*, which used sequential images to tell humorous stories.
- In the 18th–19th centuries, artists like Hokusai popularized the term manga with sketchbooks of playful drawings.
- Modern manga as we know it—multi-panel comics with speech balloons—emerged in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, influenced by Western comic strips and Japanese publications.
- After World War II, Osamu Tezuka (creator of *Astro Boy*) revolutionized manga with cinematic storytelling, laying the foundation for its global popularity.

So, manga's "origin story" is a blend of ancient Japanese art, Edo-period sketches, Western comic influences, and postwar innovation, making it both deeply traditional and strikingly modern.


- As with all comic books, not all manga is suitable for "all ages"


- Exploration of text and story that deepens our understandings!


The best selling manga of all time and has enough volumes for its own shelf
